<p><u>Alagille Syndrome Alliance, US</u></p> <p>The Alagille Syndrome Alliance (ALGSA) invites applications for its research grants. These will enable individuals to conduct basic, pre-clinical, translational, and clinical research projects in all aspects of Alagille syndrome (ALGS).</p> <p>Proposals which have little or no relevance to ALGS will not be funded. <p><u>Health innovation challenge fund</u> <u>Wellcome Trust, GB</u> and other funders</p> <p>The Wellcome Trust, in partnership with the Department of Health, invites applications for its health innovation challenge fund. This aims to stimulate the creation of innovative healthcare products, technologies and interventions and to facilitate their development for the benefit of patients in the NHS and beyond. The lead organisation must be UK based. Collaborating entities may be non-UK organisations. The following types of organisation are eligible for funding: stock market listed or privately owned companies; SMEs and start-up companies; NHS organisations and equivalent UK authorities; universities, research institutes and not-for-profit organisations. FIC will support planning grants for research-training programs that focus on major endemic or life-threatening emerging infectious diseases, neglected tropical diseases, widespread co-infections of HIV/Aids patients or infections associated with non-communicable disease conditions of poverty in developing countries.</p> <p>This funding opportunity will use the D71 grant mechanism. Individual awards will be for up to \$25,000 for one year. Eligible institutions include public/state controlled institutions of higher education, private institutions of higher education, and non-domestic entities. Call for proposals for implementation research

The World Health Organization invites proposals for implementation research. Funding will support implementation research that contributes to the scale-up of effective health interventions related to Millennium Development Goals 4, 5 and 6

Individuals from institutions engaged in research in low- and middle-income countries may apply. Applicant institutions may include research organisations, think tanks, NGOs, civil society organisations and government organisations with a mandate to conduct research. Individuals and organisations from high-income countries may participate but may not receive more than 20 per cent of the total grant value. Research teams should incorporate a mix of technical expertise, roles and responsibilities within the health system of the country. Proposals must be written in English.

The total budget may not exceed US\$350,000 over two years

The Institution of Occupational Safety and Health invites applications for its research and development fund. This aims to map the new landscape of OSH and to explore its implications for reconciling contributions to economic success and wealth creation with effective protection to workers, their families and their communities. Projects may address:

- leadership and safety, for which funding will support one project worth between £200,000 and £225,000 over two years;
- SMEs and access to OSH expertise, for which funding worth £200,000 to £225,000 is available over two years;
- the changing legitimacy of health and safety at work, for which funding worth £150,000 to £200,000 is available over two years.

<p>World Health Organization</p> <p>The purpose of this Call is to support implementation research that contributes to the scale-up of effective health interventions related to MDGs 4, 5 and 6 in one of the three priority areas described in the following section. The research proposals may be submitted for one of the following priority areas:</p> <p><i>i) Strategies to facilitate the integration of services to result in improved health outcomes and greater efficiencies:</i></p> <p><i>ii) Strategies to improve the performance of health workers (through strengthened supervision and increased motivation) to deliver quality services</i></p> <p><i>iii) Strategies for community engagement to increase awareness of, access to, and utilization of health services, and provision of appropriate services at the community level</i></p> <p>The size of the budget for each grant should be based on the scope and focus of each research study appropriate for the setting the study will be carried out. The budget for the 2-year research study cannot exceed US\$ 350 000. <p>Development research awards <u>Australian Agency for International Development (AusAID), AU</u></p> <p>The Australian Agency for International Development invites applications for its development research awards. These awards aim to support high quality, innovative research that informs policy development. The awards are a key component of the AusAID research strategy 2012-2016, which aims to improve the quality and effectiveness of Australian aid in developing countries.</p> <p>Australian and international research organisations and institutions are eligible to apply. Proposals of up to three years in duration are accepted. This aims to enable outstanding early-career social scientists to acquire the skills set to become the future world leaders in their field. Proposals are welcome in any topic that falls within the ESRC's remit. The council particularly encourages proposals involving the application of innovative research methods.

The scheme is open to high-quality candidates from anywhere in the world who have a maximum of four years' postdoctoral experience and the support of an eligible UK research organization.

Grants will last a maximum of three years with an overall limit of £250,000 at 80 per cent full economic cost. Up to 70 grants will be funded
