#### **GUIDELINES FOR ABSTRACT SUBMISSION**

An abstract is a stand-alone statement that briefly explains the core information of a study, research project, policy or program. Abstracts submitted to the conference should align with one of the conference themes as follows:

1. One health policy
2. One health education and training
3. Infectious/ Zoonotic disease
4. Antimicrobial Resistance (AMR)
5. Food safety
6. Tools detection and diagnostic of infectious agents

Under the conference themes, there are two types of abstract tracks, research and program/project tracks. The general requirements for both track types are: **A maximum of 500 words with a title of no more than 30 words in capital, bold letters is typed and presented in English, in Times New Roman or Arial font size 12, single line spacing in A4 paper, with not more than 2 tables or graphical works (figures or diagrams), if applicable.** The abstract preparation guidelines for 2 different tracks are as follows:

**Track 1: Research abstract preparation guidelines:** Suited for research conducted in all relevant disciplines. Abstracts submitted under the first track should contain contents in the following order:

1. Title:
2. Authorship: the name of all contributing authors (please do not include titles and degrees), bold in the presentation author' name, agency/organization of the presenter.
3. Summary
  - **Background:** indicate the purpose and objective of the research, the hypothesis that was tested or a description of the problem being analyzed or evaluated;
  - **Methods:** describe the study period / setting / location, study design, study population, data collection and methods of analysis used;
  - **Results:** present as clearly and in as much detail as possible the findings / outcome of the study. Please summarize any specific results;
  - **Conclusions:** explain the significance of your findings / outcomes of the study for one health problem prevention and control as well as any implications for future research.

**Track 2: Program/Project abstract preparation guidelines:** Suited for lessons learned through program or project implementation or management. Abstracts submitted under the second track should contain contents in the following order:

1. Title:
2. Authorship: the name of all contributing authors (please do not include titles and degrees), bold in the presentation author' name, agency/organization of the presenter.
3. Summary
  - **Background:** summarize the purpose, scope and objectives, of the program, project or policy;
  - **Description:** describe the program, project or policy period / setting / location, the structure, key population (if applicable), activities and interventions undertaken in support of the program, project or policy;
  - **Lessons learned:** present as clearly and in as much detail as possible the findings / outcomes of the program, project or policy; include an analysis or evaluation of lessons learned and best practices. Please summarize any specific results that support your lessons learned and best

practices;

- **Conclusions/Next steps:** explain the significance of your findings / outcomes of the program, project or policy for one health problems prevention and control and any implications for future actions or research.

#### **Abstract Submissions:**

All abstracts must be prepared according to the submission guidelines and used the abstract submission template as attached. The abstract submission template must be typed in English and submitted in word format to the Organizing Committee **before the deadline on 31 July 2018 via email:** [conference@seahun.org](mailto:conference@seahun.org).

#### **Abstract Review and Selection:**

- **Review:** All submitted abstracts go through a peer-review process conducted by a team of over 20 reviewers who have experienced in reviewing articles for internationally peer-reviewed journals and/or international conference abstracts and who have expertise in one health and/or public health related to one health discipline
- **Final selection of abstract:** After the peer-review process, the Scientific Program Committee makes the final selection of abstracts to be included in the conference program. Abstracts can be selected for oral or poster presentation.

#### **Poster Presentation Preparation Guidelines:**

- Posters should be in English
- Poster board will be provided to display your work.
- The poster size is A0 paper size; 1.8m high and 0.9m wide
- Make your own poster easy to read. Allocate the top of the poster with the title and authors' names and affiliations as stated in the submitted abstract.

#### **Submission notes:**

- Conflicts of Interest: Every abstract is expected to have no conflict of interest. If this occurs, the authors or submitters will be responsible for any conflicts of interest that may have caused to any parties.
- Confidentiality: Abstract content is confidential and reviewers are under no circumstance allowed to pass information obtained from an abstract to a third party.
